**2015 SFLA CONFERENCE
TEACHERS SAVING CHILDREN® DISPLAY**

Four Board of Trustees members -- Ruth Boyatt (OH), John Saxe (OH), John Gordon (PA), and Judy Bruns (OH) -- travelled to the January 23, 2015 Students for Life of America (SFLA) Conference in Washington, DC to manage the Teachers Saving Children®, Inc. exhibit, to sign up new members; also, to share ideas and get new ideas from the many other pro-life groups represented at the Conference. Those groups included Created Equal, American Family Association, Feminists for Life, Heritage Foundation, Susan B. Anthony List, Patriot Voices, Live Action, and more. Young pro-life Americans, mostly high school and college-age, visited the numerous displays and participated in the break-out sessions, which featured speakers like Lila Rose (video exposes of Planned Parenthood abortion centers), David Bereit (40 Days for Life), Peggy Hartshorn (Hearbeat International), Josh Duggar (Family Research Council), Abby Johnson (former abortion clinic worker; author; TV guest), Troy Newman (Operation Rescue), Kristan Hawkins (Students for Life of America president) and many more notable, pro-life names.

Professor Robert P. George received the 2015 Defender of Life Award. According to SFLA's 2015 East Coast National Conference brochure, he was being honored "for his exceptional work for the preborn and his leadership to the pro-life movement." Professor George is the McCormick Chair in Jurisprudence at Princeton University, a conservative, pro-life, Christian thinker and speaker. He is chairman of the United States Commission on International Religious Freedom.



Workers at the Teachers Saving Children®, Inc. exhibit provided resources on human development and brochures about Teachers Saving Children®. A DVD showing preborn babies played on a laptop computer, and (a new feature) large, magnetic, laminated car signs picturing preborn babies drew passers-by's attention and inquiries. One new item at the exhibit -- a hand-made, lifelike, infant doll -- prompted a man associated with NYC pregnancy centers to say, "[The presence of dolls like] this could revolutionize sidewalk counseling!"

Teachers Saving Children® members at the Students for Life of America Conference left the event with ideas to better energize our own organization. It is essential that we be highly effective if we are to reach our goals of educating about human development, exposing the abortion culture, and, ultimately, saving children's lives.

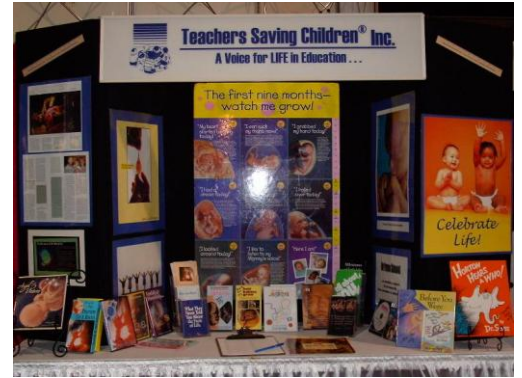

15-YEAR-OLD RAPED BY FAMILY FRIEND REJECTS ABORTION MEETS HER DAUGHTER DECADES LATER

At the young age of 15, Kathy Anderson was raped by a family friend and became pregnant. She hid the pregnancy from her parents, and because of her petite frame, didn’t show for eight months.

Kathy told LifeNews, “The night I went into labor, I thought I was suffering from food poisoning. My mother took me to hospital and the doctor announced that I was nine-months pregnant. Needless to say my mother fainted and I still had no grasp of what this meant. I gave birth to a little beautiful girl. She was perfect. I wanted her like nothing I’ve ever wanted before. She was mine..all mine. They allowed her to stay in room with me and I’ll never ever forget the smell of her or those eyes looking at me.”

However, shortly after Kathy met her little girl, her mother, doctor and social workers pushed her to place her daughter for adoption.

She said, “Even though I was young I knew I would do whatever it took to care for her. I knew I could do it. I have always survived and I saw this as just another reason to live. They finally pushed me into signing the [adoption] documents and I went into a deep depression.”

Ultimately, Kathy’s daughter, Katie, was adopted by a family in Minnesota and now she is 29-years-old. Katie lives in Scottsdale, Arizona and is studying to be a criminologist.

Kathy never regrets her decision not to have an abortion.

“I have wanted for so long to speak out of the horrors of abortion. I’ve been approached by so many people to tell my story. Adoption does NOT end your life, I’m proof. I went on to have two more daughters to replace the void left. I worked, went to school, opened a business and nothing got in my way. Both my daughters are homeowners, did wonderful in school and never missed curfews. So the pro choice people just use that as an excuse,” she told LifeNews.

In the United States, there are approximately two million families waiting to adopt a child. But unfortunately, many women contemplating abortion feel they couldn’t bear letting their child go once they’re born. Additionally, our society favors abortion over adoption because of social stigmas and misconceptions that make women believe adopted children won’t go on to have healthy and happy lives.

Nevertheless, according to the U.S. Department of Health and Services, 85% of children who are adopted are in excellent or very good health, the same as the general population. And 81% of adoptive parents described their relationships with their children as very warm and close.
